- **Annual Audit** - Dazzio and Associates will once again conduct the Town's annual audit during the last week in March.
- **Staff Updates** - Caitrin had her daughter and is currently on parental leave. She will not be back until the beginning of April. The staff is pitching in to cover for her during her absence, as well as other staff who are out of the office on vacation. If you call Town Hall and are put into the phone tree, please leave a message. We will get back with you as soon as possible.
- **Snow/Ice Conditions** - Both ice rinks are still up and running. We still have a large selection of skates in the warming hut. There is no cost to use the skates, just put them back after you are done. The Town snowmobile trail is open through to North Supply. We have worked with the County to ensure that CR 492 will remain accessible for snowmobiles as long as possible.
- **Space to Create** - We will be presenting our application for the \$4 million "Strong Communities" grant soon (this is the maximum award under this program). We have been meeting with ArtSpace and DOLA representatives to make sure that we maximize any potential awards. We are among a limited group of finalists for this award. We are still projecting a groundbreaking later this year.

Seasonal Code Enforcement



Reminder

PLEASE ENSURE THAT TRASH IS PROPERLY SECURED TO PREVENT WILDLIFE CONFLICTS AND MAINTAIN CLEANLINESS

Why is it so important to keep trash properly contained year-round?

Elk, deer, moose, bears, foxes, mountain lions, coyotes, skunks, raccoons, squirrels, magpies and crows are a few of the wildlife species that live within close proximity to the people of Grand Lake. The feeding of animals--whether on purpose or by accident--dramatically increases the possibility of conflict between these animals and humans. The purpose of this Code is to protect the public health and welfare.



Code Requirements

- The Town requires residents to **utilize Wildlife-Resistant Refuse Containers** unless the refuse container is enclosed by a wildlife-resistant refuse enclosure.
- All refuse containers and enclosures **must be kept in good repair** and function properly in order to maintain effectiveness.
- All refuse containers and enclosures **must be kept secured and latched** properly at all times when not being immediately filled.
- All **refuse must be placed into the container** and not placed on top of, under, or beside it.
- Refuse containers may only be placed adjacent to the street in front of the residence for pick-up from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on the day of trash pick-up service. At all other times the **containers shall not be on the public right-of-way**.

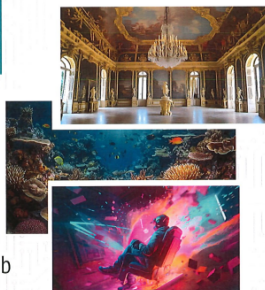

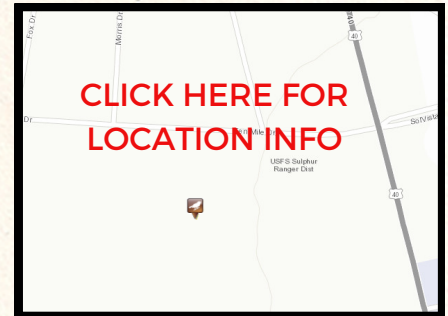

Forest Service Office Open Houses

The USFS Sulphur Ranger District is holding open houses on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m at the Forest Service office in Granby. District Ranger Eric Freels and other staff will be available to answer questions and talk about upcoming forest projects.



RMNP Ski/Snowshoe Tours
