From the Manager's Desk

- Grand Lake Adaptive Management (GLAM) The first weekly meeting of the
 GLAM stakeholders was recently held. This organization was created to monitor
 and help manage Grand Lake's clarity. The first round of data for the year is very
 promising, however, it is likely that we have such good clarity because there has
 been limited pumping so far, as the front range reservoirs are currently full. The
 data also shows that our spring was exceptionally wet and cold compared to the
 last decade.
- Building Hope Grand The Grand Foundation has recently announced a new fund and programming created to provide easily accessible information and assistance for those who are suffering from mental illness or addiction problems. If you or someone that you know needs help, please go to www.buildinghopegrand.com to find resources. This is a very important program and a wonderful step towards solving the terrible problems associated with mental illness.
- Town Code Updates Staff has been going over the Town code line by line to identify necessary changes. As we identify those parts of the code that need to be updated or readdressed in some way, we will bring them to the Board for consideration. This is a long process that started last year with the conversion of the code to a searchable and indexed version that is available on the Town website (https://library.municode.com/co/grand_lake/codes/code_of_ordinances?nodeld=MUCOTOGRLACO). Most of the recommended changes will be mundane fixes; however, there may be some aspects of the Code where the Board will want to make fundamental changes. Get ready for a year of code updates!
- **Budget Season** Department heads are working on their initial budget proposals for 2024. We will be putting the budget together in August and presenting it to the Board in September.



Pay-As-You-Throw (PAYT) Trash Program

Looking for an affordable and convenient trash disposal solution? The PAYT trash program is a self-service, drop-off facility designated **for pre-purchased bags ONLY**.

The PAYT drop-off facility is located at 601 Center Dr. (across from the Post Office, behind the car wash). All items disposed of must be in pre-purchased PAYT bag.

PAYT bags are sold at the following locations: Grand Lake Hardware, Grand Lake Center, Mountain Market, Conoco/Ted's Place and Town Hall



- 25-gallon \$5 each (blue bags)
- 40-gallon \$8 each (green bags)
