

From the Manager's Desk

- Marijuana Licenses Staff is preparing to post our licensing rules and application materials on the Town website September 5, which will start the clock running on our lottery system.
- Code Enforcement The Town is planning to increase enforcement of code provisions against noxious weeds, trash containers, unlicensed trailer storage, vehicles and trailers parked in the Town right-of-ways, and non-night sky compliant fixtures, as well as continuing to aggressively enforce parking regulations. We do not want to issue citations, so please step up and make sure that you are in compliance with our Town code and help us keep Grand Lake beautiful! - **Budget Season** Department heads are working on their initial budget proposals for 2024. We will be putting the budget together in August and presenting it to the Board in September. The board will also meet for their annual retreat this month to discuss priorities for the upcoming year.
- Public Works Projects We have welcomed several new and old faces to the PW team in recent months and they are busier than ever getting ready for our winter season. They are currently in the process of upgrading the playground equipment in Town Park (play area closed until about Sept. 1). PW staff will soon be attending the annual Snow & Ice Conference for seasonal training. Paving projects were recently approved and will begin in various areas around Town on Sept. 6.

Code Enforcement Reminder

NOXIOUS WEED ABATEMENT (ARTICLE 13-1-4)

It is unlawful for any property owner to permit or maintain any dead or live tree, noxious weeds or undesirable plants that are a "public nuisance" and it shall be the duty of the owner of such property to promptly remove or otherwise abate or eradicate such nuisance.

WASTE DISPOSAL (ARTICLE 7-6-12)

The purpose of this Code is to protect the public health and welfare by controlling the type of refuse containers to be used in order to decrease the possibility of conflict between wildlife and humans.

ABANDONED VEHICLES (ARTICLE 10)

An Ordinance of the Town of Grand Lake relating to abandoned vehicles, storage of vehicles, parking of vehicles on public right-of-way, towing of such vehicles and prohibiting the commercial sale of vehicles.

LIGHTING STANDARDS (ARTICLE 12-7-6)

These standards are intended to allow reasonable enjoyment of adjacent and nearby property by the owners and the general public while requiring adequate levels of lighting in private and public spaces.
